What does the Kitemark mean?

The Kitemark is one of the UK's most respected certification marks and is very well established in the double glazing sector. It symbolises quality, safety and trust. Kitemark certification is voluntary and shows a commitment to quality of service. You can also rest assured that surveyor and installers work has been extensively assessed, and will continue to be assessed by BSI.

Key Features of the Kitemark for Window Installers

-  DESIGN - Checks are made to ensure the windows & Doors are correct for the intended use.
-  SURVEYING - To ensure the windows & doors will fit and open correctly. Also covers risk assessment of the installation process.
-  INSTALLATION PRACTICE - Including the safe removal of old windows, fixing and sealing of frames, fitting of glazing and trims.
-  STAFF TRAINING - Surveyors and installers must demonstrate that they are properly trained and competent. Installers all have NVQ qualifications
-  PROPERTY CARE - To avoid damage to furniture, floor coverings and needless damage to decorations.
-  BUILDING REGULATIONS COMPLIANCE - Including fire, thermal efficiency and safety glazing.
-  MATERIAL QUALITY - Checks to ensure windows, doors, glass, sealants and fittings meet the required standards.
-  INSPECTION - To check that the installed windows and doors close and seal properly and have not been damaged during installation.
